1. Policy Statement:

2. Policy Details:

Develop and document a process for identifying Indigenous Peoples based on linguistic, social, governance, and resource-linked characteristics rather than state recognition.

Internal Capacity:

Demonstrate internal capacity, including personnel and resources, to implement the process through evidence-based analysis and meaningful stakeholder engagement.

3. Policy Review:

Review policies and processes at least every five years.

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Review policies and processes after any changes to the business that alter risks to the rights and interests of Indigenous Peoples.

Review policies and processes upon indication of a control gap.

Public Disclosure:

Publicly disclose the latest versions of the policies and processes.

Community Mapping:

Demonstrate internal capacity to map Indigenous communities by their cultural characteristics and engage meaningfully.

Communication:

Inform Indigenous Peoples of the relevant ASI Performance Standard requirements and the ASI Certification Audit process in an accessible, timely, and understandable manner.

4. Application:

The policy applies to all facilities where the presence of Indigenous Peoples or their lands, territories, and resources is identified through an assessment process rooted in meaningful stakeholder engagement.

5. Points to Consider:

Legal and Customary Rights: Be aware of the legal and customary rights of Indigenous Peoples that may exist in affected land areas.

Engagement: Engage with Indigenous Peoples using skilled personnel, interpreters, and culturally sensitive approaches.

Expert Guidance: Consult expert assistance to develop and maintain ongoing relationships with Indigenous Peoples.
